COVID-19 Funding for NBAPC Locals

Funding is now available for Locals to purchase Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to be used in Local meetings as per the following details:

- Receipts of the PPE purchased and minutes of the meetings are to be sent to Deanna Price (wellness@nbapc.org) for reimbursement.
- This funding is for PPE (e.g. disposable masks, disposable gloves, hand sanitizers) ONLY and not for food, beverages or room rental.
- Up to \$200 per Local.
- This is a one-time only funding.

COVID-19 New Funding

Happy New Year! As we begin 2021, I am delighted to share on behalf of NBAPC and the COVID-19 Emergency Funding Committee that this month, January, 2021, we received new funding for Emergency COVID-19. Everyone who has applied before for COVID-19 Emergency Funding must also re-apply.

NBAPC first received funding for COVID-19 Emergency Funding in late August, 2020. COVID-19 Emergency Funding applications were shared through our website, social media sites and local communities. The COVID-19 Emergency Funding Committee began receiving and reviewing applications immediately after funding was received. Our office received thousands of applications. By December 18, 2020, all of the COVID-19 funding was distributed to all applicants and families that had applied before December 4, 2020.

New funding NBAPC re d in January, 2021 is also from Congress of Aboriginal Peoples through the Inc ous Community Support Fund. All applications for this funding must be received no later than February 5, 2021. Any applications received after February 5, 2021 unfortunately cannot be accepted.

New applications for Food, Household and Educational supports are being mailed to all members. We want to ensure that members who did not apply for the first round of funding also have an opportunity to apply for this funding. The applications for Food, Household and Educational Supports are included in NBAPC's January Monthly as well, to be issued end of January. For people who have already re-applied, please forward us your application using the new applications that you will receive in the mail. New COVID-19 Emergency Funding applications are also on our website https://nbapc.org/covid-19/.

For people applying for household supports that require assistance with payment of utility bills or request reimbursement for heating supplies, etc. please provide your most recent copy of your bill and receipt with your Household application for the COVID-19 Emergency Funding Committee to review.

For people applying for Educational supports, we do offer laptops for school aged children and post-secondary students upon receipt of confirmation of registration in their post-secondary institution. As before, laptops are first come first serve. At the time of this writing, we are waiting to receive our next order of laptops. The laptops provided for student do not need to returned.

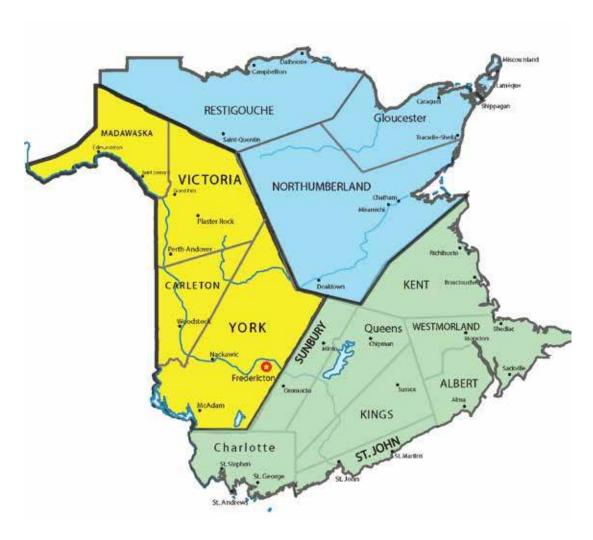
It is important to share that there can be only one application per household. We ask that people do not re-send applications or apply one someone else's behalf. Due to the high volumes of applications, we will not accept applications from anyone other than the applicant themselves. Exceptions might be made for those are unable to fill out the applications themselves. Due to confidentiality, we are unable to discuss applications with anyone except the applicant. If applicants have a question regarding their application, they need to contact the office directly. Members can apply for any or all supports. For example, if a person wants to apply only for Food supports for their household, that is their choice. Also, a person and/or household may also apply for Food, Household and/or Educational supports. Please note that COVID-19 funding is not taxable and does not have to be repaid

As before with the previous COVID-19 funding process, all applications are reviewed by the COVID-19 Emergency Funding Committee. The COVID-19 Emergency Funding Committee makes all decisions regarding applications received.

Lastly, I encourage all members to refer to our NBAPC Health and Wellness Survey. We want to know what programs and services are most important to you. The NBAPC-ISETP Summer Student Placement Program is just around the corner. Every year the ISETP Department offers students an opportunity to apply for summer employment. Students who wish to obtain a summer job in order to learn new skills and gain valuable work and life experience are encouraged to apply. Employers who are interested in hosting a summer student can also apply. Students and employers can contact our offices to have the appropriate application form mailed or faxed to them. When contacting our offices please specify whether you require the student application form or the employer application form. The deadline for application is April 30, 2021 at 4:30pm.

When applying to host a student in the Summer Student Placement Program remember:

- · The employer must provide a safe working environment for the student.
- Only Off-Reserve Aboriginals who are residents of New Brunswick between the ages of 16-30 at the time the summer placement (summer 2021) can be placed with an employer.
- Students must be supervised by the employer or a designated existing staff member at the work site during the placement.
- Any issues that may arise during the placement must be reported immediately to the ISETP department.
- Priority will be given to students enrolled in post-secondary education.
- A student's resume must accompany every student application form to be considered for an employment placement.
- Proof of enrollment in school currently and in the fall of 2021 must accompany every student application form.
- Every effort is made to place students at organizations where they will gain meaningful skills and/or learn to perform duties related to their training/career goals.
- Every effort is made to place students at non-profit organizations, organizations that are community minded and/or help provide the community with meaningful services.

COMPLETED APPLICATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE NBAPC-ISETP DEPARTMENT NO LATER THAN 4:30PM APRIL 30, 2021. STUDENT APPLICATIONS MUST INCLUDE A RESUME AND PROOF OF ENROLLMENT IN SCHOOL FOR THE CURRENT YEAR AND FALL 2021. APPLICATIONS WITHOUT THIS INFORMATION WILL NOT BE PROCESSED.

- Every effort is made to place students at organizations where they will gain meaningful skills and/or learn to perform duties related to their training/career goals.
- Every effort is made to place students at non-profit organizations, organizations that are community minded and/or help provide the community with meaningful services.

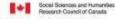

What is the Helpline & When Can You Call?

This is a 24 hour - 7 day a week Helpline

- This is a new service for all families and communities of missing Indigenous people, status and non-status, residing anywhere in New Brunswick.
- The helpline serves as a support, information and referral service system to help families navigate the various resources that may be required when a loved one goes missing.
- Gignoo staff are ready to answer your call 24 hours a day. They have been trained to assist family and friends of missing people and can help at any point when a loved one goes missing.

How Can We Help?

Support for families

- Expert people you can talk to.
- Help in deciding what you need and who you can be referred to for the right help.
- Assistance on what to expect when reporting a missing person. They can also help you gather information about the missing person to provide to the police.
- Connection to free legal advice or services. Some situations may require people to seek legal advice or specialized legal services.
- Provide information on how to use media and social media effectively to locate a missing person, as well as how to minimize the risks of attracting"trolls" and fraud artists.

TC under the Ocean Protection Plan* – November 7, 2020, was the Fourth anniversary of the launch of the Oceans Protection Plan

*The OPP (Oceans Protection Plan) supports projects with Rights Holders, other Indigenous organizations and stakeholders.

Nova Scotian Innovation Hub bringing women and Indigenous Peoples into marine safety careers under the Building Bridges for Women and Indigenous Peoples in Marine Training Program

- 1. The Oceans Protection Plan's marine training program helps underrepresented groups find jobs in the marine sector.
- One example is Nova Scotia Community College's (NSCC) "Building Bridges for Women and Indigenous Peoples in Marine Training." This four-year program:
- improves courses that strengthen skills required in the marine industry
- adds community-based training, including traditional Indigenous knowledge and specialized certification programs
- · provides mobile IT labs to increase marine program accessibility
- offers funding for training and opportunities at sea for underrepresented groups in the marine industry
- · increases staff support for Indigenous students

As part of the program, a former hardware store on the Port Hawkesbury waterfront has been converted into the Strait Area Oceans Innovation Hub. This versatile space facilitates diverse marine training activities, providing long-term solutions for training students.

Nova Scotia Community College expects to train about 95 students each year at this location. Ninety-six students have completed courses through the program so far.
